Hello Fellow Beefalo Breeders,

Lytton Bastian here from Arimo, Idaho. We have had several breeders asking about EPD (expected prodigy difference). So, for the past year the board of directors has been working with some breeders on trying to develop EPDs, a program that we are calling Breed performance. We looked into this some years back and it was going to cost the ABA a lot to get someone to write the program to track EPDs. We started looking at other options and or opportunities and found that NeoGen, a genetic testing laboratory which is headquartered in Lansing, Michigan and has an office in Lincoln Nebraska could possibly provide what we are looking for. Angus, Gelbvieh, and Simmental to name a few; are using their Igenity Services to develop EPDs for their cattle herds. We are not looking to replace UC Davis, but we would offer NeoGen for those breeders that would like to start tracking their EPDs for their herd. NeoGen would be able to provide parent verification along with giving you a report of how the animals you had tested measure up toward being replacement breeding stock or how they will gain in the feed lot. The big push here is,

the more animals tested the better the results and accuracy of that report. The ABA would accept the results provided by NeoGen just the same as UC Davis. In the future, NeoGen might also be able to tell us how much Bison is actually in our animals. We feel this could be very beneficial in the future.

By implementing this program we are wanting to improve the Beefalo breed and hopefully put more money in everybody's pocket. A really good quote I once heard and have never forgotten: "You can't manage ,if you don't measure". In this day and age we are data driven; the more data we can collect the better the management decisions we can make. This program is purely voluntary, but we would like everyone to participate. Mongolian Beef

Ingredients:

2 New York Strip Beefalo Steaks sliced(about 11/2 pounds) 3 Tablespoons cornstarch 2 Tablespoons vegetable oil, divided. 3 cloves garlic, minced 1 Tablespoon minced ginger 1/3 cup low sodium soy sauce 1/4 cup water

1/4 cup light brown sugar 2 green onions sliced into 1-inch pieces salt and pepper to taste

> **Serving Suggestions:** -with Steamed rice, white or brown -Green Beans -Stir Fry Vegetable Medley

INSTUCTIONS:

1. Season sliced steak with salt and pepper. Toss steak in cornstarch until fully and evenly coated. Set aside.

- 2. Place a large skillet over medium-high heat and add 1 tablespoon oil. Add garlic and ginger and saute' for 1 minute. Add soy sauce, water, and sugar and bring to a boil until sugar dissolves, about 2 minutes.
- 3. Pour sauce into a small bowl or measuring cup and set aside.
- 4. Place skillet back over heat and add remaining oil. Add steak and sear until evenly browned on both sides, 1-2 minutes per side.
- 5. Pour sauce back into skillet and stir together with beef. Simmer and allow sauce to thicken, 1-2 minutes.
- 6. Toss in green onion and continue to cook for 1 more minute until sauce is thick enough to coat the back of wooden spoon.
- 7. Pour Mongolian beef over steamed rice, sprinkle sesame seeds on top and serve with sauteed vegetable of you choice.

TIPS AND TRICKS FOR SUCCESS


Coating the sliced beef in cornstarch is important because it helps tenderize the beef. It also helps to thicken the sauce, allowing it to fully coat the beef.

Sear the sliced beef in batches to avoid overcrowding in the pan. This will allow the beef to sear properly and prevent the slices from steaming.
